



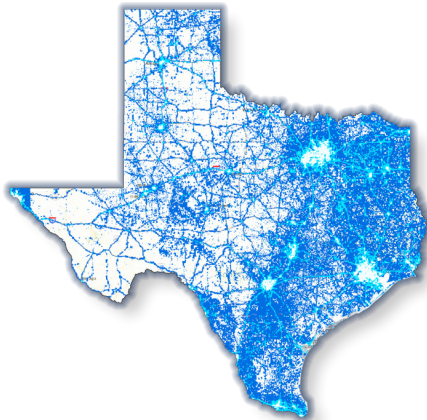

Town Hall Meeting and Coverage Mapping Workshop

Public Safety Broadband is Closer Than You Think

In recent years, Harris county and the state of Texas charted a pioneering course with the first fully-licensed public safety broadband LTE network in the nation.

In January, 2016, FirstNet released an RFP for the build-out of the network, moving the concept of a nationwide high-speed network even closer to reality.



The Texas Public Safety Broadband Program (TxPSBP) is currently working to identify coverage area requirements for public safety broadband, and FirstNet has created a preliminary coverage-objective map to serve as a baseline for each state to refine. In order to create a more comprehensive **Texas Coverage Objective**, the TxPSBP team has collected additional data, such as 9-1-1 call locations and hurricane evacuation routes.

While the Texas Coverage Objective is a good start, it is imperative that stakeholders are provided the opportunity to review the data to ensure that it meets the coverage requirements for their respective regions.

Your Input is Essential

The TxPSBP outreach and education team is traveling throughout Texas, meeting with stakeholders to discuss their coverage needs and providing an update on the status of FirstNet and the Nationwide Public Safety Broadband Network.

These Town Hall meetings also serve as an opportunity for community members to ask questions and to offer insight and perspectives that will be extremely beneficial in the planning process.
