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

- 1. Call to Order: Zoe Rascoe called the meeting to order at 10:04 am.
- 2. Public Comments: No comments were made by the public.
- **3. Staff Update:** FY22 HHW Event Applications; Revised SWAC Bylaws; Items Donated to CenTex Sustainable Communities; Federal and State Updates; Air Quality.

James McGill informed the group that CTCOG received 7 applications for FY22 HHW events from Gatesville, Temple, Killeen, Nolanville, Kempner, Bell County, and Milam County. Mr. McGill stated that one additional revision was made to the SWAC Bylaws regarding the Texas Open Meetings Act language, this revision was approved by the CTCOG Executive Committee. Mr. McGill shared that CTCOG donated some items to the CenTex Sustainable Committee and noted recent solid waste related legislation for the SWAC to review. Air Quality for the month of July was 59 ppb at the Temple station and 66 ppb at the Killeen station.

4. Action Item: Approval of the June 24, 2021 meeting minutes.

Paul Daugereau made a motion to approve the June 24, 2021 meeting minutes, seconded by Duane Herrera; the motion passed unanimously.

**5. Discussion and Action Item:** Regarding Approval of Citizen, Solid Waste Industry, and Private Sector/Business Representative Voting Members.

James McGill explained that according to the SWAC Bylaws, the group needed to reapprove or select new individuals to fill the Citizen Representative, Solid Waste Industry Representative, and Private Sector/Business Representative voting member positions. The SWAC asked if the current representatives Zoe Rascoe (Citizen), Paul Daugereau (Solid Waste Industry), and John Trigg (Private Sector) were willing to serve another two year term. They all responded affirmatively.

Bill Parry made a motion to reconfirm Zoe Rascoe, Paul Daugereau, and John Trigg as the Citizen Representative, Solid Waste Industry Representative, and Private Sector Representative, respectively on the SWAC, seconded by Mark Hyde; the motion passed unanimously.

**6. Discussion and Action Item:** Regarding Elections for FY22-23 SWAC Officers.

Zoe Rascoe explained the role of the three SWAC officer positions Chair, Vice Chair, and Second Vice Chair Ms. Rascoe stated that the current officers, Zoe Rascoe (Chair), Bill Parry (Vice Chair), and Duane Herrera (2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Chair) has each reached their term limit and must be replaced. The SWAC discussed who should serve as Officers for the next biennium. Timi Dutchuk asked why Fort Hood is not a voting member, James McGill explained that voting members are appointed by their entities elected official and Fort Hood does not elect their leadership.

Justin Brantley made a motion to elect Bill Parry as Chair, Duane Herrera as Vice Chair, and Zoe Rascoe as Second Vice Chair, seconded by Johnny Wagner; the motion passed unanimously.

7. Discussion and Action Item: Regarding the Resolution for CTCOG's FY22-23 Solid Waste Application.

James McGill informed the SWAC that the Resolution is part of the FY22-23 Solid Waste Application and Funding Plan. Mr. McGill explained that the Application and Funding Plan details how CTCOG will spend the grant money over the biennium and is required to be submitted to TCEQ along with the approval of the Executive Committee. Zoe Rascoe asked if approving the Resolution meant approval of the whole Application and whether the SWAC would be able to review the Funding Plan before Executive Committee approves it. Mr. McGill stated that the Funding Plan would be brought back for SWAC review prior to final ExCom approval.

Marcie Seele made a motion to approve the Resolution for CTCOG's FY22-23 Solid Waste Application, seconded by Paul Daugereau; the motion passed unanimously.

8. Discussion Item: Regarding AZB Draft Goals & Objectives for RSWMP Update.

Mike Carleton, with AZ&B facilitated a discussion with the SWAC on the draft Goals & Objectives list that he drafted for inclusion in CTCOG's RSWMP Update. SWAC members made various comments and recommendations for improving the language and comprehensiveness of the Goals & Objectives list.

Nolanville and Copperas Cove. Belton, Ding Dong, Kempner, Salado, Temple,
Youngsport, and several other smaller towns in Bell and Coryell Counties are
within a half hour drive.
b. The City of Killeen would like to hold one event in FY 2022. CTCOG funding of
this event will provide greater water quality protection opportunities to the
residents in the watersheds of Clear Creek and Nolan Creek, and the Lampasas
and Leon Rivers.
c. The City of Killeen is able to help reduce the cost of an event by taking
possession of several materials which would otherwise be an expense to the
CTCOG, such as automotive oil, antifreeze, lead acid and other batteries
including rechargeable batteries, alkaline batteries. We also anticipate being

paint, which will reduce costs.

#### Scoring, Selection, and Allocation of Funds for FY21 HHW Events

The Central Texas Council of Governments received seven applications for FY22 HHW Events. The budgeted funding amount available for FY22 HHW events is \$65,000 in addition to the \$2,944.65 of FY21 Earned Interest the SWAC decided to roll over to FY22 which brings the total amount available to \$67,944.65.

Additionally at the June 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting, the SWAC allocated \$8,492.60 of remaining FY21 implementation funds to the City of Temple's October 23<sup>rd</sup> event.

SWAC members were sent all of the FY22 applications, as well as a score sheet to rank each event. At this time, staff would like the Committee to review their score sheets and discuss which entities will host FY22 events and allocate funds to those designated entities.

All event applications and a summary of historical funding is included in meeting packet.

Comments on the application, if any, must be submitted in writing to the TCEQ's Waste Permits Division within 45 days of the date noted above.					
The Executive Director shall, after review of the application for registration, determine if the application will be approved or denied. The Executive Director's final action on the application will be available to view at www.tceq.texas.gov/tires/pending-applications. The applicant or a person affected may file a motion to overturn the Executive Director's final action on this registration, which is a request that the commission review the Executive Director's action on an application.
