
#### Staff Update

- a) RSWMP Update
  - On March 29<sup>th</sup> CTCOG received notice from TCEQ that they had completed their review of the RSWMP and given preliminary approval to the plan.
  - Volume I will be presented to the TCEQ commissioners for adoption during an upcoming agenda and Volume II will be put before the executive director for approval.
  - CTCOG was informed in August that TCEQ needs to amend the TAC rules before the regional plans can be adopted. This process can take up to 12 months.
  - All 24 regional plans were posted on TCEQ's website for an informal comment period from August 19 through September 20, 2022.
  - Formal public comment period February 24 through March 27, 2023.
  - TCEQ is in the process of assessing and responding to comments and preparing to file the final packet by the end of June.
  - Planning to put final rules adoption on the July 19, 2023 Commissioners agenda which would make the effective date for the plans August 10, 2023.
- b) Other Updates
  - TCEQ working on FY24-25 biennium contracts, will share draft versions with staff on May 19<sup>th</sup>.

1. Call to Order: Justin Brantley called the meeting to order at 10:04 am.

2. Public Comments: No comments were made by the public.

3. Staff Update: RSWMP Update; Other Updates; Air Quality.

James McGill provided the committee an update on the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan (RSWMP) approval process. Mr. McGill stated that TCEQ was still moving through the proposed rulemaking process and that a formal public comment period and public hearing were scheduled for the March. Mr. McGill noted that TCEQ anticipated the rulemaking process to be finished in July. Mr. McGill informed that SWAC of some vacancies on TCEQ's MSWRRAC committee and shared links to Recycling Resources from Take Care of Texas. Air Quality for the month of January was 45 ppb at the Temple station and 46 ppb at the Killeen station.

4. Action Item: Approval of the September 15, 2022 meeting minutes.

Bill Parry made a motion to approve the September 15, 2022 meeting minutes, seconded by Commissioner Johnny Wagner; the motion passed unanimously.

#### 5. Discussion Item: Regarding update on FY23 HHW Events.

James McGill provided an update on the survey results from the October 23 Temple HHW event. Justin Brantley added comments about the number of residents served and how collecting paint year round helped lower the cost of the event. Mr. McGill shared an update regarding the upcoming Spring HHW events in Hamilton, Lampasas County, Troy, and Killeen.

#### 6. Discussion and Action Item: Regarding the allocation of unused FY23 Implementation funding.

James McGill explained that following the allocation of FY23 Implementation funding at the September SWAC meeting staff discovered additional unused carryover funds from FY22 that needed to be allocated. Mr. McGill also noted that Bell County decided to return their awarded funding to the SWAC to be utilized by another HHW event. Mr. McGill stated that the total unallocated amount of FY23 funding, not including interest, stood at \$9,000.

The SWAC discussed several ideas for how to use the money and Justin Brantley shared that due to Temple's lower costs this year they did not need to receive increased funding. Bill Parry recommended that the \$9,000 be split evenly between Lampasas County, City of Troy, and City of Killeen to increase each of their total funding amounts to \$15,000.

- Lampasas County HHW Event Increase funding by \$3,000
- City of Troy HHW Event Increase funding by \$3,000
- City of Killeen HHW Event Increase funding by \$3,000

### Zoe Rascoe made a motion to allocated the unused FY23 Implementation funding to three events in the amounts listed above, seconded by Bill Parry; the motion passed unanimously.

**7. Discussion Item:** Regarding use of Implementation funds for the FY24-25 biennium.

Justin Brantley introduced this item and James McGill noted that staff was interested in whether or not the SWAC would like to explore expanding the list of eligible implementation projects so staff can research and provide recommendations on changes to the Project Application and develop a Scoring Guide.

The floor opened for discussion. Several SWAC members made comments on the various issues and needs that the region is facing as well as ideas for addressing those issues. Kara Escajeda recommended three technical studies to gather data and then determine the need for implementation projects addressing specific types of waste (tires, paint, etc.). Bill Parry requested information on how much money was allocated to Implementation projects over the past 5 years and what kinds of implementation projects those dollars were spent on. The SWAC came to a consensus that exploring new options for spending FY24-25 biennium Implementation dollars would be a useful exercise.

**8. Discussion and Action Item:** Regarding the creation of an Application and Scoring Guide Workgroup.

James McGill shared that following the previous discussion about potentially expanding the use of Implementation Funds during the next biennium staff recommends creating a Workgroup to develop a new Project Application and an accompanying Scoring Guide so the SWAC can effectively and accurately evaluate different kinds of projects that may be submitted in the future. Justin Brantley requested four to five individuals volunteer for the workgroup and clarified that the invitation extended to ex-officio members too.

Following a brief discussion Justin Brantley, Kara Escajeda, Jackelyn Ferrer-Perez, Kathryn Norris, and Marcie Seele volunteered to be a part of the working group.

Commissioner Johnny Wagner made a motion to create an Application and Scoring Guide Workgroup comprised of the 5 individuals listed above, seconded by Commissioner Lewis Bridges; the motion passed unanimously.

**9. Member Comments:** Commissioner Johnny Wagner thanked everyone for coming to the SWAC meetings to discuss important solid waste issues that are not the most glamorous things, but are very important to the residents of this region.

10. Next Meeting: May 11, 2023

# FY24-25 Planned Use of Implementation Dollars



Agenda Item #7

#### FY24-25 Implementation Funds

CTCOG receives funding from TCEQ (dependent on the legislature) every year to run the Solid Waste Grants program. This program runs on a two year cycle with the current period covering FY22-23. CTCOG must submit an application and funding plan at the beginning of each biennium to TCEQ that details how and what we will spend solid waste funds on for the two-year window.

Over the past 10-15 years, the SWAC has consistently directed CTCOG to utilize the Implementation dollars received each biennium for Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) events since there is a strong need for that in our region. However, the Implementation dollars we receive can be used many other ways. Below is a list of project categories that are approved for grant funding under our contract with TCEQ.

- Local Enforcement
  - Examples: surveillance equipment, vehicles, illegal dumping enforcement campaign, etc
- Litter/Illegal Dumping Cleanup & Community Cleanup Event
- Source Reduction/Recycling
  - Examples: recycling program equipment (e.g. balers, forklift, trailer, etc.), composting/food scrap program, recycling bins
- Local Solid Waste Management Plans
- Citizens' Collection Stations
- Household Hazardous Waste
- Technical Studies
  - Examples: New or updated local solid waste management plans
- Education and Training Projects
  - Examples: ISD recycling education

At the past two meetings the SWAC has discussed the possibility of making CTCOG's implementation dollars available to a wider range of projects. Staff has developed a draft version of a new project application and scoring guide to accommodate a potential expansion for discussion and potential approval during the next action item.

#### FY24-25 CTCOG Grant Application Form & Scoring Guide

At the last SWAC meeting, a small workgroup of members was created to advise staff on the creation of a new CTCOG Grant Application form and accompanying Scoring Guide for FY24-25. The new application form and scoring guide expands the list of eligible solid waste projects under the CTCOG Solid Waste grant.

The workgroup met with staff once in March to review the grant application forms and scoring guides utilized by other COG in Texas as a starting point for CTCOG's new grant application form and scoring guide.

Included in the packet are draft versions of the FY24-25 Grant Application Form & Guidelines for review. The documents are still in draft form and staff can make any changes requested prior to approval.

If necessary, another meeting could be held later this summer for final approval of the FY24-25 Grant Application Form & Guidelines prior to the FY24-25 Call for Projects.

# Item 9: Scrap Tire Facility Application Review

#### Scrap Tire Facility Application

On April 25, 2023 CTCOG staff received notice from Meyer Tire Recycling, Inc. of their Scrap Tire Facility application to TCEQ for a permit to process scrap tires. The proposed facility is located at 502 W Ave O in Belton, TX.

TCEQ requires that scrap tire facility applicants must notify local authorities including the City Mayor, County Judge, Regional Council of Governments, and Local Fire Authority of their application. TCEQ requests that the SWAC review these notices and applications for consistency with CTCOG's overall goals, objectives, and RSWMP, and provide any feedback to the agency for their consideration.

The SWAC and any other local authority has 45 days from the notification date (April 25) to submit comments to the TCEQ Executive Director if the proposed facility does not comply with local requirements relating to scrap tire management. These comments must include adequate documentation of noncompliance.

A copy of Meyer Tire Recycling's application is included in the packet for your review. The deadline to submit comments to TCEQ is June 9, 2023.

**Recyclers** and **energy recovery facilities** can have more than 500 whole used or scrap tires on the ground or 2,000 whole used or scrap tires in enclosed lockable containers under the 30-day supply rule (30 TAC §328.63). We will be implementing into our schedule a bi-monthly vector control inspection. Employees will be instructed to report any container or equipment that is holding water. Facility will constantly process tires to avoid retaining water. Will keep grass cut short and shrubbery well trimmed. Vector control tablets may be used in any water that is not natrually draining. Fogging or spraying will be implemented as needed in the mornings and evenings to control mosquitoes. We will have rodent control by using rodenticide baits, natural repellants, and traps inside the facility. Assistance from other commercial pest control will used as needed for complete vector control in our facility.
