Federal Transportation Administration (FTA)'s FY 2023 Low or No Emission and Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Competitive Programs

The FTA is providing \$1,221,350,117 and \$469,445,424 for each program respectively under one NOFO for the purchase or lease of zero-emission and low-emission transit buses, including acquisition, construction, and leasing of required supporting facilities, and financing of buses and bus facilities capital projects, including replacing, rehabilitating, purchasing or leasing buses or related equipment, and rehabilitating, purchasing, constructing or leasing bus-related facilities. 0.5% of funds are able to be used for workforce development activities eliaible under transportation law. Eligible applicants include States and local governments as well as entities that provide funds for fixed route bus operators. No grant recipient will receive more than 10% of total program funding. Federal share of costs is 85% for projects involving leasing or acquiring transit vehicles, and 90% for those involving acquiring, installing, or constructing vehicle related equipment or facilities. Federal share won't exceed 80% for other costs. The deadline to apply is April 13th, 2023. For more information and to apply, click here!

USDOT's Small Business Innovation Research Program awards contracts to U.S. small businesses to pursue research on and develop innovative solutions to our nation's transportation challenges. Solicitation for offers on contracts of up to \$200,000 for six months for research and development or feasibility related experimental work on topics including traffic monitoring using Edge Computing, virtual reality training on impaired driving for law enforcement, bioremediation for hazardous materials spills, and more!
