USDOT Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Grant Program

The SS4A discretionary grant program will provide \$5-6 billion in grants over FY 2022-26. The grant application period has now opened for FY 2023. Funding supports regional, local, and Tribal initiatives through grants to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries. Eligible entities include:

- Metropolitan planning organizations;
- Counties, cities, towns, other special districts that are subdivisions of a State, and transit agencies; and
- Multijurisdictional groups of the above entities.

Funds may be used to:

- a) Develop an Action Plan;
- b) Conduct supplemental safety planning to enhance an Action Plan; and
- c) Carry out demonstration activities to inform the development of, or an update to, an Action Plan.

Award sizes of \$100,000-\$10 million.

- d) Carry out projects and strategies identified in Plan. Award sizes of \$2.5-25 million.

Match is at least 20%.

Defense Community Infrastructure Pilot Program

This program provides \$250,000 to \$20 million to local governments and non-profits for community infrastructure projects in support of a military installations, including those related to transportation.
