Federal Transportation Administration (FTA) Innovative Coordinated Access and Mobility (ICAM) Pilot Program

This program provides \$4.7 million in competitive grant funding for FY 2023 and an additional \$4.8 million for FY 2024 to projects that improve access to vital transportation services for older adults, disabled people, and low-income individuals. Eligible applicants are:

- State departments of transportation
- Designated recipients for Section 5310 funds
- Local governmental entities that operate a public transportation service or their eligible subrecipients
- Private entities that provide shared-ride on demand service to the general public on a regular basis.

Applicants must serve as the lead agency of a regional or statewide consortium that includes stakeholders from the transportation, healthcare, human service, or other sectors. Eligible projects are capital projects, as defined in 49 U.S.C. 5302(4) that improve the coordination of transportation services and non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) services, including:

- Regional or statewide mobility management projects
- Deployment of coordination technology; and
- Regional or statewide projects that create or increase access to one-call/one-click centers

There is no minimum or maximum award amount and match will be minimum 20% unless the project is for vehicles (15%) or vehicle related equipment (10%). Applications are due **February 13, 2024**. For more information and to apply, click [here!](#)

FEDERAL & STATE LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

FHWA Advanced Transportation Technology and Innovation (ATTAIN) Program

This program provides \$60 million for FY 2023 and \$60 million for FY 2024 in awards to local governments, transit agencies, and MPOs to deploy, install, and operate advanced transportation technologies to improve safety, mobility, efficiency, system performance, intermodal connectivity, and infrastructure. Ride N Safe

The last CTRTAG meeting was held in person on **November 16th, 9:30-11:00 AM** at the CTCOG Offices. This meeting had a presentation from Cliff Montemayor, the CEO of Ride N Safe-this organization offers non-emergency medical transportation service across 22 counties in Texas and in our region in Bell, Coryell, and Hamilton counties. Ride N Safe provides ambulatory (walk-on assist), wheelchair, and reclining stretcher-chair transportation. Drivers begin at 4 AM and run until midnight daily, 365 days a year. Door-to-Door & Bed-to-Bed services provided, and same-day request service with average pick up time 2-4 hours.
